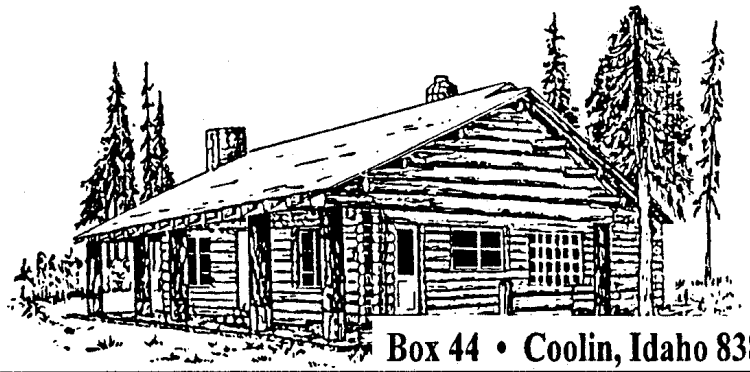

1995 VISITOR REPORT ... Host Coordinator Regina Manser reports that there were 5,252 visitors during the season. They came from Maine to California and every state in between, from Alaska, west from Hawaii, and south from Florida and New Mexico. Foreign countries represented were Korea (signed book in Korean), Germany, Holland, Russia, France, Italy, England, New Zealand and the Republic of South Africa.

Volunteer host hours contributed during 1995 were: 101 days @ 6 hours or 606 hours. 34 volunteer hosts participated. We salute Regina and her corps of volunteers/hosts.

In August there was a graphic story of "History of Fire Fighting" that came on loan via the Forest Service.

The multi-purpose room upstairs at the museum is now furnished with two banquet tables and 12 lovely, comfy chairs. We also acquired a TV and VCR so that educational programs can be presented. There are new cottage curtains in the kitchen, which add to the ambiance of that popular room.



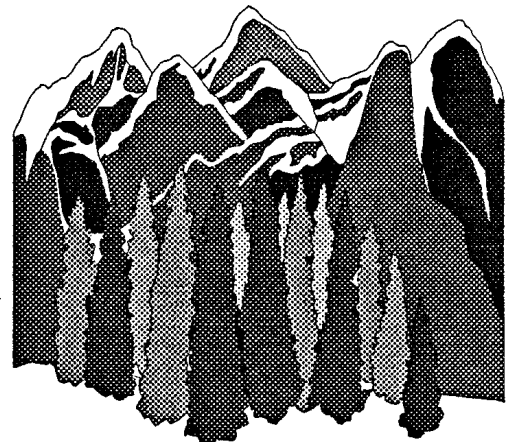

HISTORIAN ... Kate Batey requested and received from "Manuscripts, Archives and Special Collections" from W.S.U. a set of photocopies of the Alva and Myrtle Allen guest book of August 16, 1962. The Allens homesteaded near the upper lake, "Allen-a-Dale." Their book includes entries from 1920 to 1957. This document will be on display at the museum for the 1996 season.

Kate has also interviewed and taped narrations from Bob Hungate, Catherine Simpson, Claude Simpson and Dick Hungate. They record experiences at Priest Lake as early as 1914. She has scheduled two more interviews later in October.
