

NEW BEGINNINGS... the year 2000 will bring some exciting beginnings to Priest Lake Museum! It marks our 11th season open to the public. Significant and interesting exhibit alterations and additions will occur under the talented hands of Display Coordinators, Pam Martin and Marita McDonough, who have agreed to assume this challenging position as G G Fisher seeks much-deserved retirement. Our Nature Garden will finally be near completion and we anticipate a public celebration as an official opening ceremony. The date is Saturday, August 13, 2000 at 1pm in the Garden.



WATER WIZARDS... the rest of the story—As related in last Spring's MISELM REVUE, the groundwork was laid for an automatic sprinkler system in the Nature Carden. Realizing that we are dealing with native wild plants which require less water than domestic garden plants; our plan was scaled back to include a basic valve box with lines to perimeter heads which will cover the entire garden and be operated manually from the valve box. This will enable us to water in periods of extreme dry weather. We had hoped to start this project early last Spring, but were repeatedly thwarted by high ground water. In September, after having dug down over 5 feet and still not finding the main water line from the pumphouse; frustration set in!—But then came our break!!

Bob LaFontaine, a Project Manager for Parrott Mechanical and a son-in-law, was visiting Mary and me. Learning of our problem, he suggested; "Let's have a look". After surveying the garden site for a few minutes, he looked at me and said; "No problem!" That was Sunday.

Early Tuesday morning, Bob and one helper showed up with everything needed to put in a sprinkler system. The deceptive water line was $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet deep! For two days, Parrott Mechanical furnished the manpower, expertise, equipment and parts to install our system at no cost to the Museum! When the fence pylons are in place, the sprinkler heads will be set.

We all can thank Bob LaFontaine and Parrott Mechanical by patronizing a company that gave our little Museum a great big break! — and that's the rest of the story from Jim McDowell.
