



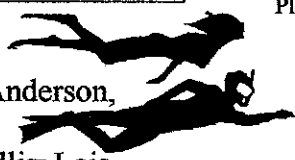

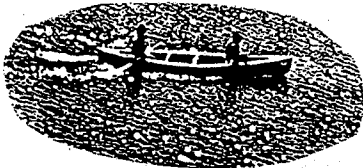

WHAT'S NEW AT THE MUSEUM - - - there's been action in the gallery while snow covers the ground and the bears hibernate! A "brainstorming session" last Fall, involving Executive Officers of the Board and the Display Team, resulted in approval of a proposal presented by Marita McDonough and Pam Martin. This proposal included gallery alterations to accommodate the initial installation of our indoor mining exhibit. It will be completed by opening day this Spring. Thanks to Vern Melvin, Bill McInerney and Kay Coykendall for their expertise in accomplishing the time-consuming alteration tasks. With that work in place, Marita and Pam are busy installing a display which will add immensely to our mining resource. Treat your family and friends to a visit this summer and see for yourself!

WITH MINING IN MIND - - - The Priest Lake Region was host to many mining operations in the late 1800's and early 1900's. We know of Continental, Nickelplate, Milwaukee, Woodrat, to name some. These explorations provided significant influence on the early economy. The Museum is working with the U.S. Forest Service toward a future installation of a permanent outdoor mining exhibit. So we need all the artifacts, information, photos, reminiscences, and mining implements, such as items of clothing, hardhats, flashlights, tools, etc. that we can find. If you have items or knowledge of items which might be appropriate to this project, please contact Pam Martin at 208-443-2001, Marita McDonough at 208-443-3070 or any Board Member. Arrangements can be made to interview you, pick up artifacts and copy photos.



MUSEUM BACKBONE - - - VOLUNTEERS continue to be the backbone of Museum operations. The time and energy expended by Board Members are gifts which are mostly unseen and unsung. Their reward comes in knowing that thousands of visitors from around the nation and the world enjoy and learn about Priest Lake when making a visit to the Museum. More visible are our valuable Museum Hosts, whose dedicated commitment keeps our doors open to the public. Last season, this irreplaceable corps of volunteers tallied **522 hours** meeting and greeting visitors; youngsters through oldsters. Some of these Hosts have been "stepping up to the plate" since the Museum opened in 1990! - - and they still enjoy it. Perhaps you'd like to help. A MESSAGE FROM DEBBIE BUTLER - - - "Spring is slow to arrive at Priest Lake this year as the snow still lingers near the lake and in the mountains, but the preparation and planning continue for some major upgrades to the Museum. Planned projects include repairs to the main building foundation, installation of a new cedar shingle roof and replacing the porch pillar logs. The garage would receive new lights and other treatments in order to allow this space to be converted to a video/movie viewing area. Hopefully, by May I will know if we will receive the funding to complete these projects. If selected, some of the work may proceed in 2006 with the remainder to occur in 2007.

The Priest Lake Museum would not be possible without the many dedicated volunteers and the support of the community. I look forward to working with everyone involved for another fun and productive year."



REACHING OUR GOAL - - - Although some grant requests for funding of the historical video, "The Early Days of Priest Lake", have been successful, it is taking longer than anticipated to accrue necessary funds. We are still short of our budget to complete this worthwhile project.

The Mining Fund, established Fall of 2004, continues to grow. Some results will be seen in a new exhibit this season. As more artifacts are acquired, the Board of Directors hopes to expand the mining displays, since area mines were an integral part of the early history of the region.
